


Lemons and Limes!



Game Objective: Pupils match words with the same pronunciation but different spelling.
Game Type: Matching
Classroom Organisation: Teams or individuals
Language Area: Vocabulary and pronunciation
Useful for: Reading skills, word forms, pronunciation, spelling

- 1. Choose 5 words which you know have another word with the same pronunciation but different spelling. Examples are 'most' and 'toast', 'time' and 'rhyme', 'meet' and 'meat', 'heard' and 'herd' etc.
- 2. Divide your class into roughly 5 teams (depending on your class size this may vary) and indicate this on the board.
- 3. Draw a lemon shape on the board and write a word inside it. Draw a lime shape that is empty inside.
- 4. Give teams 10 seconds to find a word with the same pronunciation but different spelling. You can help by saying the word in the lemon to the class.
- 5. The first team to give a **valid word** gets the point!
- 6. The team with the most points WINS!
- 7. You can add a bit of colour by colouring in the lemon and lime.

REMEMBER:

Some pupils might give the same vowel sounds which have different spellings. Give half a point!
