

Odd One Out!

One Out **REMEMBER:** Do a mix of easy and difficult words to maximize pupil participation.

Game Type: Spot the difference Classroom Organisation: Teams or individuals Language Area: Vocabulary Useful for: Word meanings, word relations, word reference, word forms, pronunciation, spelling (so many!)

Game Objective: Pupils identify words which are different in some way to the other words.

- 1. Divide your class into roughly 5 teams (depending on your class size this may vary) and indicate this on the board (see picture above).
- 2. Write 4 words on the board. Make sure one of the words is different in some way. In the example above 'potato' is the odd one out because it is a vegetable and the others are fruits.
- 3. Give teams a time limit (10 seconds) to think and choose.
- 4. The first team to give the correct answer gets a point!
- 5. Pupils can play this game individually and check their own answers.
- You can vary the game so that the odd word out can be based on its form, spelling, pronunciation (seem, team, bread, beef – bread is the odd one out because it has an /e/ sound and the others have an /i:/ sound.
